
The fun goes on! More events to enjoy:

2020 Calendar launch at Village Lunch

Many thanks to everyone who came along to the first Village Lunch on Saturday 24th August where guests were invited to eat and chat al-fresco whilst enjoying stunning views over the fields from the churchyard. Sixty-five villagers, visitors, relations and friends turned up with plates of delicious food and drinks to share. Look out for details of another village get-together next year.



The HCCF also took the opportunity to launch the Harberton 2020 calendar together with a selection of postcards—designed by Jonathan Bean depicting beautiful views around Harberton. Powering on with the Tower Works ... and more

The Church Council is, this month, putting in two funding applications, supported by your valuable donations to the HCCF pot, to allow the clock chamber floor to be repaired this year—and then have our beloved clock reinstalled in time for Christmas. David White's legacy has not only enabled the clock to be fully repaired and upgraded to electric working but also means that none of our wonderful community volunteers will be in danger of a nasty accident climbing the steep steps.

After this, funding applications will be made for the rest of the agreed tower works (more permanent repairs to the roof, walls and bells, as well as for materials) to support better access for everyone to the wonderful history and treasures of the church. We hope these will be successful and enable those works to be done in 2020.

At the same time, the Church Council has very sensibly decided to have a really thorough inspection of our rather fragile main church ceiling to establish the work that needs to be done, obtain quotes and start to raise the funds. This is likely to be very costly and any funds from the Tick Tock

appeal that are left over, once the tower works are done, will then be put towards the main ceiling repair. HCCF will also make a contribution from its unrestricted fund towards the cost of this ceiling inspection. The HCCF will also be contributing towards the on-going maintenance of repairs it has helped to fund so far - the



wonderful window repairs and the emergency tower repairs.

So, lots has been done, plenty going on and loads more to do! All thanks to and with the ace support of our lovely community, near and far. Thank you!

Since our last update we've enjoyed several fantastic events in our brilliant community!

The Harberton Secret Gardens & May Fair was held over a weekend, instead of the usual Strawberry Fair. The 2-day Secret Gardens, plant sale and cream teas, as well as Saturday's May Fair (BBQ, raffle, cakes, books, bric-a-brac, etc) raised a total of £2499! £1659 was allocated for building repairs and £840 for general church running costs. A hugely successful combined Church Council and HCCF event.
