

# Ding Dong Merrily on High - in Harberton the Clock is Chiming!

After St Andrew's Church clock being out of action for almost four years, it is finally back - keeping good time and the bells chiming reassuringly day

and night again.

The clock has been fully restored by the Cumbria Clock Company and brought up to date with electrification, ending the onerous job of hand winding, required since it was installed in the 19th century. The clock was a gift to the Church from Sir Robert Harvey, which we now know was made in 1858 by internationally renowned clockmakers, Gillet and Johnston. Founded by Kent clockmaker, William Gillet, he opened his factory in Croydon in 1844, so our clock is one of his earliest timepieces. From 1884



to 1958 the company also made bells - but not the ones used in our church, which date from 1762!



Gillet and Johnston continue to make clocks that are to be found around the world and in some of the most iconic buildings, including town halls in
