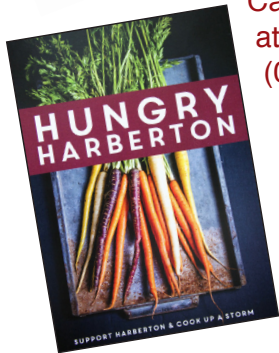

As of the Annual Parochial Church Meeting in May, our Church Wardens are Alicia Stolliday and Sally Watson.

Keep looking up...

...to **The Pinnacles** at the top of the church tower. These are facing some urgent repairs. The problems are in three locations: There are areas at the base of both the north side pinnacles where stones and mortar have fallen out, leaving holes, but of more concern undermining the support to the two north pinnacles which already lean outwards. There are cracks between the pinnacles and the parapets which indicate that there is some progressive movement. The third issue is cracking in the stonework at the top of the stair turret, which has also progressed recently.

Is the **Flag** flying today? Our splendid new flag has suffered some fraying to the fabric due to snagging on the lightning conductor, but this issue is being addressed and should be rectified soon.
