The Tick Tock Appeal, to which so many of you donated, has contributed £4,000 towards this, to support a grant to the Church Council of £2,500 from the National Churches Trust. It's a real joy to start to see the fruits of many months of fundraising.



Tower works ... the next steps

As we wrote in the last update, HCCF has offered to use Tick Tock funds to pay for half the remaining works in the tower - this includes roof, walls and bells. The Church Council is working hard to get the clock back in during this year, with the other works being scheduled for 2020. This timeline will allow for grant funding to be secured to cover the other 50% of the costs (meaning that every £1 of yours in the Tick Tock fund will actually become worth £2), whilst also taking account of winter weather and availability of the various contractors. A Grants Group has been set up by the Church Council to research and prepare funding applications. We will support this in every way we can. We wish them the best of luck and will keep everyone updated on their progress.

Did you know... St Andrew's Church has three spiral stairs?





You may have known there was one or even two, but three?!
